

International Circumpolar Surveillance-History

- 1998: CDC's Preventing
 Emerging Infectious Disease: A strategy for the 21st Century
- 1998 ICS Established
 - Streptococcus pneumonae
 - Northern Canada, Alaska
- 1999: US Chairs the Arctic Council, ICS QC begun
- 2000: ICS approved as a Arctic Council SDWG project; Greenland joins ICS
 - Haemophilus influenzae, Neissera meningitidis, GAS, GBS added



International Circumpolar Surveillance

- 2001 Iceland, Norway, Finland, northern Sweden join ICS
- 2002: Protecting the National Health in an Era of Globalization: CDC's Global Infectious Disease Strategy.
- 2007-2008 International Polar Year- ICS activities continue
- 2007 Tuberculosis working group initiated
- 2010 Climate Change and Infectious Disease working group initiated

International Circumpolar Surveillance Lessons learned...

- Model for international surveillance
- Capitalizes on existing government/non government health cooperatives
- Capitalizes on existing surveillance systems (inexpensive)
- Provides standardized laboratory and epidemiologic data on invasive bacterial diseases
- Comparable across regions
- Identifies research needs and priorities
- Can be expanded to other health concerns of Arctic peoples.
