
Denmark

- Denmark is a sovereign state in Northern Europe, with two additional overseas constituent countries forming parts of the kingdom;
- the Faroe Islands in the North Atlantic
- and Greenland in North America.



- 89.6% of Denmark's population of over 5,580,516 is of Danish descent.
- The remaining 10.4% are immigrants—or descendants of recent immigrants.
- There are also small groups of Inuit and Faroese


Global TB incidence 2010




Danish TB notification


 Yearly cross cheking of all notified cases with the National Reference Laboratory of Mycobacteriology, Statens Serum Institut




Number of cases 1990-2010 by gender

TB 2010

- 359 cases notified with TB in 2010 (incidence: 6.5/100.000)
- 224 (64%) of cases diagnosed among immigrants hereof 65 (28%) cases among Greenlanders in Denmark (incidence: 450/100.000)
- Overall, 79% verified by culture, hereof 81% of all pulmonary cases.
- 57 % of pulmonary cases positive by microscopy
- 7% of culture positive cases mono resistent and two cases multi drug resistent

Conclusion

- Overall low TB incidence, outbreak in late 1990ies, however increasing number of cases from 2009
- TB mostly among immigrants including Greenlanders
- 2010 showed an increasing number of TB cases among Greenlanders in Denmark
